**Toni Jennings**  
Former Lt. Governor, State of Florida

Florida's first female lieutenant governor, two-term president of the Florida Senate, successful businesswoman and former fifth grade teacher, Toni Jennings is among the most prominent public figures in Florida's history, dedicating more than 27 years to the citizens of Florida.

Jennings has distinguished herself as a skilled consensus builder, shaping key policy initiatives important to Floridians for almost three decades.

Jennings served as Florida's 16th lieutenant governor, as well as an unprecedented two consecutive terms as president of the Florida Senate. In 1976, Jennings became the youngest woman ever elected to the Florida Legislature and the first female Republican leader of either house of the Legislature.

Jennings' strong business acumen and years of public service contributed greatly to her successful partnership with Gov. Jeb Bush as his lieutenant governor, championing key initiatives in the areas of health care, education, post-hurricane housing, insurance reform and aeronautics.

A native of Orlando, Jennings began her professional career as a fifth grade public school teacher at Killarney Elementary School in Winter Park.

At the age of 23, Jennings joined her father's commercial construction company, Jack Jennings & Sons Inc., of which she served as president from the mid-1980s until becoming lieutenant governor in 2003.

Jennings' commitment to civic duty is reflected by her many years of service on various community boards and commissions such as the Florida Chamber of Commerce, first chair of Workforce Florida Inc., the Rollins College Board of Trustees and the University of Central Florida Foundation Board.
