In the next 10-15 years Florida will have a revolution of living and transit styles. The goal will be to get people out of their cars and onto commuter rails and eventually light rails. With the immense growth projected for our state and the sprawl and increased commuting that comes with that growth, parking capacity in cities such as Orlando and Miami will not be able to keep up. Communities will emerge in areas around future commuter stations where people will be able to live, shop, park and catch a train to other stations and to work. This is the future that Florida's Department of Transportation is planning for and has already begun to appear in South Florida.
